School Summary

Louise White Elementary School opened in 1978 and was named after Louise Conde White who was born in 1875, went to Batavia schools, taught in Batavia schools, and was a principal of Batavia's East Side School from 1922-1934. LWS is one of six public elementary schools in Batavia and was named an "Exemplary School" in 2018 by the Illinois State Board of Education. LWS is also home to the District's STAR program for at-risk kindergarten students.

Academics and Student Support

Core Content Areas: Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies

Innovative & Enrichment Programs: Art, Music, Physical Education, STEM, Health

Student Support: Offer programs to support English learners, students with disabilities, and gifted and at-risk learners. Student services staff includes 3 special education teachers, 1 social worker, 1 psychologist, 1 EL teacher, 1 speech pathologist, 3 interventionists, and 1 enrichment coach.

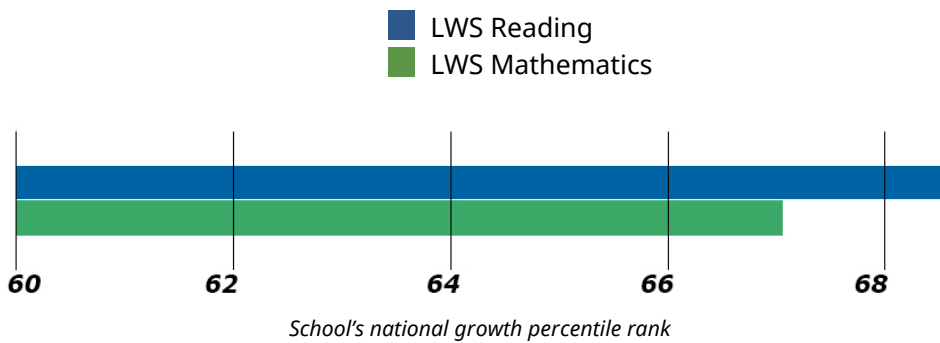

NWEA MAP Test Scores

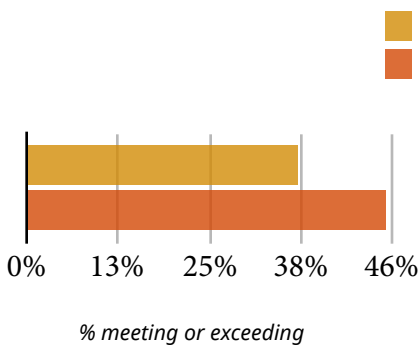
Louise White Elementary School assesses all students in fall, winter, and spring with the NWEA MAP test in the areas of reading and mathematics. Based on 2018-19 national data, LWS students outgrew students nationwide by 69% in reading and 67% in math.



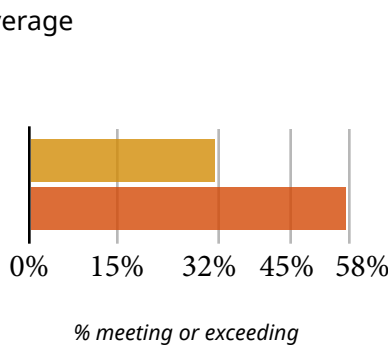
IAR Results Meeting and Exceeding

BPS101 students also take the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) assessment. In 2018-19, LWS students performed 26% better than the state average in Math and 8% better than the state average in English Language Arts.
